Dear Parent/Carer,

As we race towards the Easter holidays, I thought I'd drop you a line about some of the things happening in school. At CMS, we work hard to develop the whole child, wherever we can, enriching the curriculum and developing our pupils as well-rounded Codsall Citizens, so as usual, we have a lot going on.

Next week, we know our pupils will be excited to be welcoming mums into school for our Mother's Day lunches: the Magistrates Court Competition which happens this weekend, helps to develop important life skills and an understanding of the rule of law; the Easter Fayre will give pupils the chance to organize and run stalls to raise money for others; we have had STEM workshops for pupils from St Nicholas and Birches First Schools, planned, organised and led by our STEM Ambassadors; we've celebrated Red Nose Day and World Book Day and Y5 have enjoyed 'Bringing Bools to Life' workshops; we'll also be welcoming our first volunteer parents into school to share their careers experiences with Year 8 pupils.

### Staffing

We have a few staffing changes happening at the end of the term. Firstly, Mrs Machin is retiring from teaching after nineteen years at CMS. She has always been a highly valued colleague who has contributed so much to the life of our school over the years, attending residentials and running her popular French Chocco Lotto club as well as teaching French to many years of our pupils. In the summer term, she will be replaced by Mrs Croot, who many of the children will already have met around school.

Also leaving us at the end of term is Miss Evans, who is moving on to pastures new outside teaching. We'd like to thank her for all of the contributions she has made to our school. We will be covering Miss Evans's timetable internally with Maths teachers that pupils already know. Mrs Wafer, our school receptionist, has also moved on to a promoted position elsewhere and Mrs Hydon will be taking on this important 'front of house' role for us.

## **Social Media Use**

We know that a lot of parents will very much understand our frustration about our pupils' use of social media. Our pastoral staff are spending a huge amount of time in school dealing with online friendship issues and name-calling that have happened while pupils are at home – time which could be better spent supporting our pupils with their wellbeing and their learning.

We always want to help as much as we can but it is very difficult for us to make any sizeable impact. Over the last few weeks, I have spoken to pupils about taking the following steps to keep themselves happy and safe online. We would very much appreciate your support in repeating these steps at home and checking that your child is following them.



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# Simple steps to keep yourself safe and happy on social media

These are all easily in your power to do so take control

The safest of all is to remember the legal age for social media like WhatsApp and Snapchat is  ${\bf 13}$ . This is when experts deem that young people are mature enough to use the platforms safely.

Advice for those who do use social media...

- 1. Don't join large groups stick with small groups of friends you know and trust.
- If people add you to groups that you don't want to be in, leave immediately.
- 3. As soon as you see unpleasant or bullying comments in a group, leave it.
- 4. Block people who say unkind or insulting things about other people. They may behave that way to you at another time.
- 5. Think very carefully about what you say once it's written down on line it lasts forever

If you're worried about dealing with unpleasant <u>behaviour</u> online, speak to a parent who can help you by following these 5 steps or reporting the comment.


#### **Careers**
